

- Initially hosted by the larger school district in the County
- No base funding
- Currently community led and organized

Drafting the Plan

- 2019- Small DOH grant awarded to Yakima County Parent to Parent to develop a local Interagency Transition Network
- Local stakeholders convened to determine next steps
- Hosted training with Lori Scott, ESD 123, and Dana Floyd, ESD 105, to share a 'blueprint' of what an ITN could be
- Convened multiple stakeholder meetings to determine local strengths, challenges and gaps of transition to adulthood services and supports in Yakima County
- Identified short and long term goals

Laying the Foundation

Developed the Mission/Vision statement:

Mission:

The mission of the Yakima County Interagency Transition Network, in partnership with community stakeholders, is to support every student with disabilities as they transition into adulthood and establish meaningful community engagement that honors individuality and personal choice.

Vision:

We are dedicated to promoting welcoming and inclusive communities for people with disabilities.

- Developed member communication plan <u>Transiton Padlet</u>
- Developed meeting flyer/calendar and meeting structure

Meeting Frameworks

- Workgroup that structures and plans meeting topic, presentations, and ITN yearly goals
- Open community transition training opportunities
- Subcommittee's that engage parent and district partners

Our Successes

- Diverse group of engaged stakeholders who were engaged at the beginning (DDA, DVR, ESD 105, Children's Village/Parent to Parent, PAVE, employment vendors, schools, parents, DD County Coordinator/Health District)
- COVID 19 Virtual meetings increased engagement of different stakeholders
- Shared leadership
- Regular communication and information dissemination
- Developing infra-structure (communication/teaming tools, meeting flyer, etc.) Subcommittees – parents and school stakeholders
- History of working well together!

- COVID-19- our ITN was launching just as the Pandemic started

- Engaging district partners within the county
- Determining the structure of meetings that benefitted all stakeholders
